## Update November 2018 - Friends of R1:11

Dear friends,

As the nights draw in I find myself with more time for prayer, the darker evenings mean I'm spending more time at home with my thoughts and with more time for personal growth.

In Uganda the children in all schools who have reached the end of the Primary education and are therefore in class P7 Primary 7 will soon be sitting their Primary Leaving Examinations. These are very important and allow them access to secondary education and I'm sure you will all join me in praying for all these children that they may be able to trust in God and do well so that they can have a better future.

In addition the older children in S4 are sitting their O levels and also need prayer. Following this they can either leave school, go on to vocational training or continue to A levels and higher education. If they stay in education the costs increase quite significantly, often to a level higher than our sponsors can manage. Please pray for the children and their sponsors, as decisions are made about these children's futures and let me know if you would be able to consider helping to fund higher education for any of the children current sponsored through the Romans One Eleven Trust.

The school year in Uganda runs from February to the end of November, so the children will soon be commencing their long break. This means that they can spend longer helping their parents/ guardians in the fields or at home, which is of great benefit to families because of the very labour-intensive methods of farming and domestic life. Families in Uganda seldom go "on holiday" as we in the UK love to do when we can manage it! It also means that schools can take time to do necessary repairs/ make new developments when funds permit. Please pray at this time for the schools with which Romans One Eleven partners, especially Ssanje School (Samuel Muhumuza), Joherbson School (Duncan Sebachwa), Ebenezer Primary and Secondary Schools, Bugoye (Charity Loryn), Orborne and Blessings Schools, Kakumiro (Julius Bigirwenkya) and Batalika Model School (Bernard Byamukama).

I'm sure you'll all be excited to hear that this year's edition of Mutually Encouraged has been sent to print and if you have requested a copy it should be with you in the near future, We would all like to thank Ian for his hard work editing this and getting it ready for us.

I'm sure in the past you have all been aware of Samuel Muhumuza's fiancée Grace's ill health, but we are very happy to report that after attending her last medical examination she is now cancer free. God works miracles and we are all so happy for both her and Samuel.
